# MESSAGES FROM THE DEPUTY PRINCIPAL YEAR 11 AND YEAR 12



At Flagstone we are always encouraging the importance of attending school every day so students have every chance to learn into their future. Attending school every day prepares students for success. Both parents and students have a role to play in making sure their child attends school.

Currently I have noticed that there have been students not attending for a number of days at a time. Obviously, if you are sick then you are not able to be here, however, if you are



well it is vital to be at school especially in the senior years, to make sure you can pass your subjects and receive the help you require from your teachers to understand the content and the skills you have to use to complete your work.

### Our Attendance policy reminds students to:

- Attend school every day, attending every lesson on time
- Attend every lesson while at school
- Track their own attendance to ensure they meet the school requirements of 90%
- Complete their attendance diary page, including percentage and attendance goal, during week 5 and week 10 of each term.

### Every parent has a responsibility to:

- Ensure your student attends every day of school, on time
- Ensure the school is notified if your student is absent from school for any reason
- Track your student's attendance to ensure they meet the school requirements of 90%
- Ensure, when students are being collected from school, that the person who collects them is on the OneSchool contact list.

### Collection of students through school hours:

If parents need to collect their child from school through the school day for an appointment, please provide your child with a note explaining the reason for the absence and the period of the day that they will be leaving the school grounds.

Please remind your child to take their note to Education Services before school starts, so a leave pass can be issued at the time requested for the departure from school. If a student is required to leave school grounds without a parent, or delegated adult, present, we require this authority via email. The office email address is office@flagstonescc.eq.edu.au.

Students have a responsibility to follow this process, so they can present themselves at the correct time to the Administration Office. This process will also assist parents with attending the appointment for their child on time.
