NEWS FROM THE ACTING DEPUTY PRINCIPAL YEAR 7 AND 8



At Flagstone we are always discussing with students the importance of attending school every day so they have every chance to learn now and into their future. We currently have a 90% attendance goal for all students to meet as attending school every day prepares students for success. Both

parents and students have a role to play in making sure their child attends school.



Our Attendance policy reminds students to:

- Attend school every day, attending every lesson on time
- Attend every lesson while at school
- Track their own attendance to ensure they meet the school requirements of 90%
- Complete their attendance diary page, including percentage and attendance goal, during week 5 and week 10 of each term.

Every parent has a responsibility to:

- Ensure your student attends every day of school, on time
- Ensure the school is notified if your student is absent from school for any reason
- Track your student's attendance to ensure they meet the school requirements of 90%
- Ensure, when their student is being collected from school, that the person who collects them is on the OneSchool contact list

Collection of students through school hours:

If parents need to collect their child from school through the school day for an appointment, please provide your child with a note explaining the reason for the absence and the period of the day that they will be leaving the school grounds.

Please remind your child to take their note to Education Services before school starts, so a leave pass can be issued at the time requested for the departure from school.

Students have a responsibility to follow this process, so they can present themselves at the correct time to the Administration Office. This process will also assist parents with attending the appointment for their child on time.

BRING YOUR OWN DEVICE (BYOD 2022)



In 2022, Flagstone State Community College is excited to have its last year level (current Year 9 students) join our Bring Your Own Device (BYOD) laptop program. This means that it will be mandatory for students in all year levels to bring a suitable device to school each day. Our BYOD program

began in 2019 because:

- Modern teaching processes require the use of a digital platform, such as OneNote
- We are faced with an increasing number of aspects of classroom learning that are becoming computer based, including:
 - communication between students and teachers

- homework and assessments
- educational videos and access to educational resources
- collaborating with other students
- textbooks
- Laptops allow teachers to expand their instructional strategies and personalise learning for students
- Laptops allow for effective engagement. Our Gen Z students are visual, adaptive, flexible and collaborative learners
- Laptops extend student learning beyond the classroom. It allows for seamless movement between school and home
- Most schools in our region have a one-to-one BYOD
 program

If you don't already have a suitable laptop, parents of students will need to purchase a Windows or Apple Mac laptop device for 2022. Information about the program and the minimum laptop specifications required are listed in the BYOD Information Guide on our website. To keep costs to families at a minimum, we have kept the specifications as simple as possible, while still being functional. NOTE: Please do NOT purchase a Chromebook, Android, Linux device, as they do not work on the Education Queensland network.

It is also important to point out that we are moving to additional electronic textbooks, so your involvement in the program is fundamental to your child's learning. These electronic textbooks will be a resource inclusion to the 2022 Student Resource Scheme.

We will of course provide assistance to families who are experiencing severe financial hardship. Further information on our equity policy is outlined on our website

SCIENCE WEEK



Science Week Activities

The theme for Science Week 2021 is Food, Different By Design and all this week our Science technicians and teachers will be running activities looking at the different properties of some foods and the Science behind them,

On Monday, Ms Hunter and Ms Chase helped some students make edible "Orbeez" using Cold Oil Spherification. This involved dropping a hot solution of flavoured juices with agar into beakers of cold oil allowing the droplets to solidify and form edible balls. This practice is common in food preparation from making Bubble Tea, fast food drinks and also in gourmet cooking to present sauces on dishes in high end restaurants. The Science behind it is using cold temperatures to change the state of matter of a molecular solution known as a Hydrocolloid.



On Wednesday, Ms Hunter and Mr Poels held an instant ice-cream workshop. Students were able to mix up flavours of ice cream with milk and sauces and have it instantly cooled down to an ice cream consistency with liquid Nitrogen. The liquid nitrogen is -196 degrees Celsius which is around the same temperature of Neptune, the coldest planet in our solar system. It causes the fat and the water particles to stay very small, giving the ice cream its creamy consistency. We even had lactose free!

This process is used in vegetable preparation to make sure frozen peas are fresh for longer.

Some students also looked at the properties of dry ice and how something so cold can boil.
